FRIDAYS, 11 A.M.

Gallery Talk on Celebrating 75 years—Pathways of American Art at the Morse Museum. Learn about the more than 60 objects in the exhibition, which include paintings, pottery, art glass, and works on paper. Together the works reflect the range of the Morse's collection and the values of the Museum. Free with admission.

The Morse Museum, home to the world's most comprehensive collection of works by Louis Comfort Tiffany, is located at 445 N. Park Avenue. Through April, the Museum's hours are 9:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday and Saturday; 9:30 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Friday; and 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday.
